Hosta 'Frances Williams'

- **Use:** Hostas are exceedingly popular perennials in today's gardens due to their versatility in the landscape. Their subtle colors, tall flower scapes, and broad, coarse leaves fill a niche in garden designs that few other plants can achieve. This is a sport of 'Elegans' and remains one of the best-known cultivars of hosta.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun (best)–shade. If they receive too much sun the yellow margins will burn in the hottest part of the summer. Acid, moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Slug resistant.
- **Growth:** Grows 26 inches tall by 63 inches wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The large leaves are blue-green with a golden yellow border and really stand out in the shade garden.
- Forms a large mound of thick corrugated leaves.
- **Flower:** White flowers are displayed just above magnificent foliage on 30" scapes in midsummer
