

Tahoe Evergreen Candytuft



Iberis sempervirens 'Tahoe'

- **Use:** This easy to grow, drought tolerant, deer resistant, evergreen subshrub becomes completely enshrouded in innumerable 1" brilliant white flower clusters from very early Spring into Summer. Attractive, evergreen, texturally-rich foliage acts as a lovely foil for other plants throughout the rest of the year. Tough as nails and needing little maintenance beyond a light pruning once flowering is done, it gives you a great show for very little effort. Provide good drainage for best plant health. Attracts bees and butterflies! Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part shade. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Superb in borders, beds, and open woodland gardens.
- **Growth:** Growing to about 1' tall and 2' wide, its relaxed mounding form is perfect for gently cascading over the border of a bed or tumbling out of a pot.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-10, perennial
- **Foliage:** Herbaceous, evergreen perennial and a floriferous selection for borders, rock gardens or for use as a groundcover.
- Cutting grown.
- **Flower:** Its low-growing, mounding habit complements the 1" large cluster of white, four-petal flowers that appear prolifically each spring.

Use it to edge your driveway in part sun conditions. Lovely drifts of white blossoms resemble drifts of snow.
