

# Variegated Yellow Flag Iris

## *Iris pseudacorus* 'Variegata'

- **Use:** Long arching leaves grow 3-4' in length, especially in shallow water. An intricate creation that can grace your own created landscape. Beautiful! Flowers are excellent for cutting. After the plant has finished flowering just remove the flower spike... don't cut the plant back to the ground. All parts of Iris are deer resistant. Quite hardy and prolific, given it's exotic good looks. "**Thrives on neglect**".
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Tolerates up to 4" of water. In times of drought supplement water.
- **Growth:** Grows 30" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 36" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Substantial clumps of green, yellow and pale green variegated strap-like foliage. Leaves have been known to revert to green during the season.
- **Flower:** In late May and early June, the graceful clumps are topped with fragrant, yellow blossoms.
