

Poco Orange Hot Poker



Kniphofia uvaria 'Poco Orange'

- **Use:** Also known as Torch Lily Features tidy clumping of grassy, green foliage from which bright, long blooming flower spikes arise. This one is especially attractive to hummingbirds and doesn't appeal to deer. Makes a great cut flower, patio container or landscape plant. Long tap root gives good drought tolerance.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Allow soil to dry slightly between waterings. Drought tolerant once established
- **Growth:** Fast growing evergreen foliage 18in. high, flower spikes 32 to 36 in. tall.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone** 6-9; Perennial. Very heat and drought tolerant!
- **Foliage:** Long grass-like leaves.
- **Flower:** . Produces dense spikes of deep burnt orange tubular flowers tipped in red that adorn short sturdy spikes beginning early in the season and continuing throughout summer
