

Jean Davis Lavender

- **Use:** 'Jean Davis' Lavender's unusual, soft pink flowers and approachable flavor in the kitchen set it apart from the crowd. The most-looked to English Lavender for culinary preparations, its fruity and never-bitter taste lends the right quality to recipes. Or, plant 'Jean Davis' with other lavenders to create a colorful drift of muted contrast. Use it in dry gardens, barren slopes, or bordering a sunny path. Its ornamental compact habit makes it a welcome addition to the perennial border.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 6 hours afternoon sun. **Soil must be sandy and have a pH of 7, so add lime. NO RED CLAY!** Keep water off the leaves, water under foliage. Good drainage, pH, and air circulation are key to success.
- **Growth:** Grows 12-18" tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-10, Perennial. Mulch heavily around the plant
- **Foliage:** Evergreen in warmer climates. Scented leaves.
- **Flower:** Soft pink flowers bloom all Summer and attract butterflies. Lavandula are an indispensable member of the herb family, used for perfumes and potpourri. The flowers are sweet instead of pungent or bitter.

Great as a garden plant and for drying and arranging.
