

French Lavender



Lavandula 'Goodwin Creek'

- **Use:** Fine for mass plantings and banks, or containers for poolside...attracts butterflies. Great in perennial borders or rock gardens.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Good aircirculation so don't crowd them. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 6 hours afternoon sun. **Soil must be sandy and have a pH of 7, so add lime as needed. DO NOT PLANT IN RED CLAY!** Keep water off the leaves, and water under foliage.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall and wide. Prune back occasionally to promote new growth and flowers. If pruned more severely early in the season, the plant will stay more compact – otherwise over time it will have a tendency to open up and sprawl.
- **Hardiness Zone** 5-9, Perennial. Mulch heavily around the plant
- **Foliage:** Scented leaves. Deciduous. Long leaves with small scallops or dents.
- **Flower:** Flower spikes are rounded, light mauve-lavender flowers and green buds in mid-late summer.
