

Provence Lavender



Lavandula intermedia 'Provence'

- **Use:** Fine for mass plantings and banks, or containers for pool-side...attracts butterflies. "Provence" is more moisture tolerant than other varieties, and is recommended to gardeners who have difficulty overwintering lavenders. Recommended as one of the best culinary varieties. When you travel to the French countryside, where lavender is grown commercially for oil and flowers, this is one of the cultivars you will find.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 6 hours afternoon sun. **Soil must be sandy and have a pH of 7, so add lime. NO RED CLAY!** Keep water off the leaves, water under foliage.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness** 5-10, Tender perennial. Mulch heavily around the plant
- **Foliage:** Scented leaves. Deciduous. Cutting grown.
- **Flower:** The light purple flowers are very fragrant, and dry beautifully for potpourri.
