- **Use:** Purple shamrock's pretty foliage and dainty flowers make it a good choice for containers, borders, or indoors. Purple, triangular leaflets that close at night. Nice houseplant. Native to Brazil. Non-invasive cultivar. This amazing heat-loving false shamrock comes from our friends at Yucca Do, who got it from a Houston gardener named Francis, who discovered it as a garden seedling.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers light shade and moist but well-drained soil outdoors. Indoors, provide bright light and cool temperatures.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-8" wide and high. Will reseed so be sure to give it room!
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-11; Perennial. Also can be a houseplant.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The handsome 3-lobed foliage is purple with large, shamrock-shaped leaves.
- **Flower:** .The clumps are topped in fall with light lavender flowers.
