

Brise d'Anjou Jacob's Ladder



Polemonium 'Brise d'Anjou'

- **Use:** The leaflets form opposite pairs along the stems giving a ladder effect hence the common name of Jacob's Ladder. This stylized form along with the foliage coloration makes for one of the most unique and striking of plants. It is attractive from mid spring until frost. It forms a graceful tall mound that is offset by racemes of pretty flowers for most of the spring. A very strong and vigorous grower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers part shade morning sun being best. Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. For a neat appearance, remove old foliage before new leaves emerge. Divide clumps every 2 to 3 years in early spring.
- **Growth:** Foliage mounds 15-18" high and 18-24" wide are stunning spring to frost.
- **Hardiness:** Perennial; Zone 4-8
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Stunning and very distinctive cream edges to the foliage.
- **Flower:** Dainty blue flowers on 20-24" stems bloom in late spring to early summer.
