

Blue Self Heal



Prunella grandiflora

- **Use:** This friendly carpeter from Europe's meadows produces cheerful blue snapdragon-like flowers in summer; perfect for groundcover or edger. Low-growing plant with dark green foliage and purple-blue flowers. This plant makes an excellent ground cover in the shady corners of the garden. It forms a dense carpet of green foliage and summer flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 6-12 "tall, by 12-18" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Medium green leaves hug the ground.
- **Flower:** Trusses of rich-violet flowers from June to September.

Commonly called Large Selfheal because of its use in herbology.
