

Sedum Lemon Ball Basket



Drought tolerant and so easy to grow! Very good at controlling weeds also.

Sedum 'Lemon Ball'

- **Use:** A terrific low evergreen groundcover for sunny areas with poor dry soil. When planted in containers or on a wall this develops a beautiful cascading habit. Nifty bright chartreuse mounding/trailing succulent foliage spills nicely from containers or over a raised border edge. Sturdier and less apt to shatter than 'Angelina'. . Does well in large rock gardens where the plants can be given room to spread. Best with occasional to no foot traffic. Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun, but will tolerate some shade. Prefers well-drained soil, but It will tolerate most soil types and is drought resistant.
- **Growth:** Grows 4" tall and continues to spread. Plants may be pruned back at any time if they get too large.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. This forms a trailing mat of succulent golden-yellow leaves.
- **Flower:** Clusters of yellow starry flowers appear during the summer.
