Spreading slowly to form a dense mat, this drought tolerant succulent is perfect for planting in crevices of stone walkways and walls. Attractive in containers.

- <u>Use:</u> Among the easiest plants to grow, Hen-and-chicks tolerate heat, drought and neglect with style. Useful in rock gardens, container gardens of all types, rock walls and rooftop and vertical gardens. Hundreds of varieties exist. All types form a low cushion or carpet of fleshy leaves, tiny new plants appearing in a circle around the mother in the middle. Hardy, drought-tolerant little plants form a dense, jewel-like ground cover. It will thrive and multiply in even the toughest growing conditions.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in full sun. Prefers well-drained soil, and is very drought tolerant. Needs very little fertilizer.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 6" tall and 1-2' wide. Spreads more over time, but not invasive.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-10; Perennial
- *Foliage*: Semi-evergreen. Tiny blue-green rosettes are covered with fine, cobweb-like hairs.
- <u>Flower:</u> Bright rose-pink flowers appear on leafy, 4-inch stems in summer.
