Fast growing! Purple blossoms.

Azalea 'Dwarf Formosa'

- **Use:** Antique variety rediscovered by A. van Hoogenmoed. Makes a nice screen in the shade or for a woodland garden. More deer and rabbit resistant than other azaleas, but still may need protection until larger. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Upright growth to a height of 3 to 4 feet tall and 6-8 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7b-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Slightly furry green leaves.
- **Flower:** Large purple blossoms are 2-3" wide.
