Azaleas work well massed or as specimens in woodland gardens, mixed borders, foundation plantings, and containers.

Azalea 'Katherine Allison' (Aromi hybrid)

- **Use:** Perfect as a large growing hedge or in a shady spot in the landscape. It works well in many garden settings including woodland plantings, mixed borders, and as a specimen. The Aromi hybrids were developed by Dr. Gene Aromi, a retired University of Southern Alabama professor, and his wife Jane, a retired elementary school teacher in Mobile, Alabama. They began their hybridizing program in 1969 to develop evergreen azaleas with "large flower size, early bloom time, improved bud hardiness, compact habit, and array of flower forms, and rich colors"
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefer part shade generally. We don't recommend full sun unless you have fantastic soil and irrigation. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Plant matures at 3' to 4' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 7 -9** Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen
- **Flower:** Deep pink, frilled flowers in spring
