

# Lavender Spider Azalea



An excellent understory species beneath canopy of pines and other trees

## *Azalea 'Koromo Shikibu' (Macrosepalum)*

- **Use:** The mid-season blooms always draw raves despite the floral competition in our display garden. This can get pretty large, so give it room! This rare Azalea's compact growth habit, durability, and rare flower form make this a definite conversation piece.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part shade. tolerant of a wide range of growing conditions as any azalea, although all azaleas grow best in a well drained soil and in filtered sunlight. Pruning is sometime required on plants that grow quite large.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 4 to 6 ft. tall and wide or wider.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Green leaves.
- **Flower:** Long strap-like lavender flower petals spread out in a spiderly fashion giving this azalea a very unusual appearance. Fall rebloomer.
