Camellia japonica 'Elizabeth Ann'

- **Use:** Camellias are evergreen shrubs grown for their flowers. They are among the earliest blooming plants and there are cultivars that bloom in fall, winter, and early spring. They are excellent for shade and woodland gardens and also for containers.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, sunny or shade, and any well drained neutral/acid soil. Extreme summer heat may cause leaf burn; needs some shade if planted near a white house due to reflection of sun.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing to 6 to 8' tall and 4 to 5 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen, glossy.
- **Flower:** Formal double blooms of white with a pink edge and back. Early spring bloomer. Prune only right after blooms fade.
