

Camellia 'Greensboro Red'



Camellia japonica 'Greensboro Red'

- **Use:** A beautiful deep red flowering camellia with dark green foliage and large semi-double flowers that are nearly 3-5 inches in diameter. Flowers appear in late winter, early spring. Camellia's make great small evergreen landscape trees when pruned up and even work well in large containers. This variety was sent to Greensboro, NC by Europe in 1893 and was adopted as the city flower in 1965.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, sunny or shade, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing to 10 to 12 ft. tall and 7-8' wide, larger with age.
- **Hardiness:** 6-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Vigorous, compact, upright, evergreen shrub, valued for dark green foliage.
- **Flower:** Large red, single to semi-double flowers. March-April. Prune only right after blooms fade.
