

Apricot Flowering Quince

Quince is more than an early-spring delight. It stays semi-evergreen all summer and fall, and autumn brings attractive fruit that makes a tasty tart-flavored jelly and brings birds to the thorny protection of its branches. We love them as cut flowers to bring indoors the joy of spring!

- **Use:** Quince is a deciduous shrub that flowers a double, apricot-pink flower in late winter. A good choice for use as a hedge, in mixed borders, and mass planting.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun to light shade. Flowering is best in full sun. Tolerant of most soils including very dry soils.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing 4 to 5 feet tall by 4 to 5 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9, shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Small green leaves.
- **Flower:** Double apricot-pink flowers in late winter.
