

Chapel View Japanese Cedar



A new introduction that shows great promise for use in a variety of landscape application such as foundation plantings, groupings, hedges, medium height screens, and even in container gardening.



Cryptomeria japonica 'Chapel View'

- **Use:** With its broad pyramidal habit yet compact form, this lovely evergreen fits beautifully in small space gardens. A 12-year-old specimen was 7' in height and 5' in width, and can be readily pruned to maintain a desirable landscape size. Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full/part sun and could tolerate a fair amount of shade; well-draining soil and appreciates slow release fertilizer.
- **Growth:** Moderate growth to 5'-10' tall x 4-8' wide at a rate of 5-8" a year. Prune in early spring. This variety responds very well to trimming / pruning and, therefore, may be maintained in a variety of heights & widths as needed. It is a really good choice for areas where some screening or privacy is needed, but space limitations dictate the need for something that doesn't grow too tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; The blue-green needles are resistant to winter bronzing and add a touch of color to the winter landscape.
- **Flowers:** Not known for flowers.
