

# Pink Minor Deutzia



## *Deutzia 'Pink Minor'*

- **Use:** The starry flowers of this vigorous dwarf cultivar are pale pink. Hybrid deutzia is a cross between *Deutzia longifolia* and *D. discolor*. A compact, deciduous and has arching branches that offer a fountain of small pink flowers in spring. It is easy to grow, hardy and can withstand tough growing conditions. Despite its arching branches, this graceful plant is quite compact. It will be covered in dainty light pink flowers during May over small, finely toothed, deep green foliage that is overcast with plum in the fall. A lovely little chap! Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring. Soil must be amended with a rich organic matter or peat based soil. Will not tolerate red clay. For a tidy, neat appearance, shear annually to shape.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 2 to 3 ft. tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8, Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Its elliptical leaves are medium green, held opposite to one another on the stem and offer little fall color.
- **Flower:** Beautiful clusters of pink star-shaped flowers appear in late spring.

**Dainty flowers grace this tough shrub in spring.**
