

Blue Chiffon Rose of Sharon



Late season color for hedges, perennial or shrub borders, specimen and containers.

This is a nice addition to the mixed border, and can also be used as a specimen plant for late summer interest. Excellent for hedging.

Hibiscus (Althea) syriacus 'Blue Chiffon'

- **Use:** The Chiffon® series just got more exciting with the addition of this white-flowered selection. It has the same vigorous growth and lacy blooms, but with large, single white flowers. Each is adorned with a lacy center to create an anemone-like bloom. Bold yet delicate, it is a star in the garden from late summer to fall. The distinctive flower color complements many popular late summer perennials.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun in ordinary soil. To increase bloom and to shape, prune to 2 buds per branch when dormant. Prefers to be watered under the leaves.
- **Growth:** Grows 9-12' tall and 6-8' wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-9 Shrub/ Small Tree. Very heat tolerant!
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Medium green maple-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Unusual blue flowers for the late summer garden.
