

Incrediball Hydrangea



Very hardy and reliable. This adaptable native plant produces huge flowers (as much as 12" across) and is both reliable and beautiful. Very cold hardy Incrediball blooms on new growth so even very cold winters won't keep it from blooming.

Hydrangea arborescens 'Incrediball'

- **Use:** This stunning hydrangea is a bit of a prodigy. We were looking for a hydrangea like the old favorite 'Annabelle', but one that wouldn't flop over. We found it...and it had supersized blooms, too!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in a sunny, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 4-5 feet high; equal width in only 3 –4 years. Plant 6' apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Massive flowers bloom in summer, and are held up by very sturdy stems. Flowers open green, then mature to white before turning green at the end of their life cycle. Good for cut flowers. Native.
