

# Little Lime Hydrangea



**Works well in a mixed border, woodland garden, or even a large container**

## *Hydrangea paniculata* 'Little Lime'

- **Use:** A new dwarf form of the ever popular 'Limelight' hydrangea, Little Lime sports the same great flowers and coloration as 'Limelight' but in a smaller package. At one third the size of traditional hardy hydrangeas, this new variety fits well into any landscape. It is outstandingly cold hardy. Because Paniculata Hydrangeas bloom on new growth (unlike the lacecap and mophead Hydrangeas which bloom from buds produced the previous year) they typically flower normally even if the twigs have been killed back by frost. Prune in late winter or early spring.
- **Exposure/Soil:** It thrives in morning sun afternoon shade, but also tolerates heat and humidity. **DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN!**
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 3-5 feet high; equal width in only 3 –4 years.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Summer flowers open soft green and turn pink and burgundy in fall. The autumn display of chartreuse and pink blooms on the same plant is breathtaking!
