## *Ilex cornuta* 'Burfordii'

- **Use:** Not to be confused with the dwarf type this fast growing holly makes an excellent screen. The colorful winter berries are great to use in winter floral arrangements and attract birds. Use as a large hedge or specimen tree.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun-part shade. Well-drained soil, not soggy. Water the 1st two years for best growth. (If it doesn't rain for 7-10 days, then water.) For fastest growth use slow release fertilizer two times a year!
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 20-25 feet tall and wide. Can take on any shape you wish and they are very easy to train into shape. Can be trimmed as in top left photo, pruned up into a more lollipop tree shape, or left to naturalize as in the bottom photo.
- **Hardiness:** 5-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Glossy foliage on a large pyramidal form.  
**Flower:** Not known for flowers. Prolific bearer of large, bright red berries without a pollinizer present, though heavier with a male pollinizer.
