

Taylor's Rudolph Holly



Dense, fine textured, rounded; small green leaves emerge with purplish tinge; red berries

Ilex vomitoria 'Taylor's Rudolph'

- **Use:** Has a low, mounded habit and foliage that is much darker green than any other dwarf yaupon on the market. Glossy, bright red berries in winter complete the package. Outstanding! Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** A sturdy North American native, Yaupon Holly is adaptable to a wide range of cultural conditions, from well-drained to wet, acid to alkaline, and sun to part-shade. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Water if it hasn't rained in 2 weeks.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall, and 4-5' wide with a mounding form.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Lustrous dark green leaves on gray stems.
- **Flower:** Small white flowers in spring that mature into red berries by the fall or winter.
