

Loropetalum 'Carolina Midnight'



With some of the darkest foliage you'll encounter in the genus Loropetalum, 'Carolina Midnight' is a great new introduction that will add some purple punch to the garden.

- **Use:** Like a midnight sky Carolina Midnight Loropetalum is definitely one of the darkest that we have come across. Dark burgundy rounded foliage contrasts with the near red frilly flowers in spring. New growth emerges a light reddish maroon. Chinese Witch Hazel is a nearly indestructible evergreen and can be pruned to form or allowed to grow into a large rounded shrub.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Full– part sun.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing to 6 to 8 ft. tall and wide, but can be kept smaller.
- **Hardiness:** 6-9, shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Dark purple foliage. One of the darkest Loropetalums on the market.
- **Flower:** The flowers are like dark fuchsia fireworks in a sky of purple.
