

Candy Stripe Native Azalea



Perfect for use as a small shrub in flowerbeds or woodland borders or other areas of the landscape that provide dappled shade or morning sun with afternoon shade. Use it as a specimen or plant several in a cluster.

Rhododendron 'Candy Stripe'

- **Use:** This Whitney hybrid has pink buds that open to flowers of a clear very light pink with a darker pink blended into soft stripes and a yellow spotted throat. Full trusses make for a good show to brighten any corner of your garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun to shade. As with other azaleas, the partial shade of tall trees overhead is the ideal. You just need to water it during times when it isn't raining enough. Plant them shallowly and mulch well to conserve moisture and suppress weeds. Grows best in moist, well-drained, organic soils with a pH range from 4.5 to 6.0. "Well-drained" is the key. Planting it in places that don't drain well is a sure death sentence.
- **Growth:** Grows 5ft. tall and 5 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9b; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Leaves up to 4" long, light green.
- **Flower:** Remarkable pink, white, and yellow selection of the Oconee azalea in March-April.
