

Blue Rambler Climbing Rose



Rosa 'Blue Rambler' / 'Veilchenblau'

- **Use:** Multiflora type rambler, nearly thornless, with clusters of small, cupped flowers in violet, streaked with lilac and white. Stamens yellow. Foliage luxurious and mild green. An altogether magical rose capable of sheer enchantment on pergolas, in trees, etc.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off the leaves (no sprinklers/ don't water leaves.)
- **Growth:** It can be grown as a climber; trained against a wall, up a pillar or through an obelisk; or even grown as a tall hedge. Left alone, it grows to about 10-20 feet high by 8 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-10 Climber or Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Foliage is light green and stems are nearly thornless.
- **Flower:** Purple/mauve with a white eye and lighter reverse, small semi-double bloom, 10' - 12' rambling rose and non-recurrent

Great choice for the trellis or arbor of cottage or country gardens.
