

Red Drift Groundcover Rose

Rosa 'Meigalpio' (Red Drift)

- **Use:** These repeat-bloomers naturally resist rust, mildew, Japanese beetles and especially black spot. A cross between full-size groundcover roses and miniatures, Drift Roses have a low, spreading habit that makes them perfect for container gardening, hanging baskets and rock gardens.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 18-24" tall and 2' wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-10 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Small, semi glossy, dark green leaves. Should be pruned back to 4" in late winter for best repeat performance year after year.
- **Flower:** Dark red flowers cover this small, mounding shrub from spring to early winter. Petal count of 20-25 and 5-8 blossoms a stem.
