

Anthony Waterer Spirea



Spirea bumalda 'Anthony Waterer'

- **Use:** Flowers and leaves all appear on the same side of the arching branches. Flowers are attractive to butterflies. It has no serious insect or disease problems, and is effective in borders, cottage gardens, foundation plantings, or hedges.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant once established
- **Growth:** Moderate growth upright, compact, mounded deciduous shrub which typically grows to 2-4' tall with a similar spread.
- **Hardiness:** 4 -9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Prune in late winter to early spring. Narrow, dark blue-green foliage.
- **Flower:** Profuse deep pink flowers in small corymbs cover the arching stems of this plant in late spring. Cut back lightly after blooming to encourage more blooms.
