- <u>Use</u>: Do you dream of the scent of lilacs wafting from your garden? Katherine Have-meyer Lilac (Syringa vulgaris 'Katherine Havemeyer') will fulfill all of your lilac dreams and then some. has that typical wild lilac form that adds such depth and beauty to your garden. Use it as a specimen plant in a border or foundation planting or in a perennial bed as a structural counterpoint to spring bloomers. Strong and long lived, this popular shrub is easily grown in a normal garden soil and full sun. No need to coddle it. It's tougher than it looks!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Requires well-drained soil and full-part sun. Thrives in cool summer climates so best to look for a cool spot in your garden to protect from summer heat. Prune to shape right after blooming. Apply a controlled release fertilizer in the spring. This variety has good powdery mildew resistance. MUST HAVE GOOD DRAINAGE! NO RED CLAY! ALSO NEED TO ADD LIMESTONE TO SOIL TO GET TO pH of 7
- **Growth**: Make sure you give it plenty of room to grow, though. It quickly reaches its full height of 10-12 feet tall and 8-10 feet wide. It makes a very colorful border or screen.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-7; Shrub will need protection from heat in our area.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Foliage is burgundy-tinged in fall.
- Flower: This beautiful French Hybrid covers itself in abundant clusters of double, lavender-pink, fragrant flowers on dark green, disease resistant foliage. There are so many blooms that you smell her luscious classic lilac scent long before you see her in the garden.
