

Viridis Laceleaf Japanese Maple



This captivating dwarf Japanese maple with bright green, lacy foliage

and strongly cascading branches forms an elegant dome-shaped specimen over time. It is the most vigorous and adaptable of the green foliaged laceleaf maples. Mature plants have lovely and elegantly twisted branches that stand out through the winter months.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Viridis'

- **Use:** Vivid green, finely cut leaves change to beautiful shades of gold and crimson in the fall. Small tree with graceful weeping habit and excellent branching architecture. An excellent accent under larger trees, near a water garden or in container. Thrives in dappled sun.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers part sun. Protect the upper trunk, the trunk will be susceptible to sun burn damage. Planting near an older tree which might shade it in the hottest part of the day can help. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Will not tolerate soggy or extremely dry soil.
- **Growth:** Slowly reaches 8 to 10 ft. tall, 8 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8, medium sized tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Green, lacy foliage. In autumn the leaves turn bright orange with golden yellow undertones and crimson highlights.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
