

Forest Pansy Redbud



Lovely pink spring flowers in early spring.



An excellent specimen tree that is very disease resistant. Attracts birds, butterflies, and beneficial bees.



Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy'

- **Use:** Tree with short trunk, rounded crown of spreading branches, and pink flowers that cover the twigs in spring. A picturesque tree with maroon-purple leaves and a wide, umbrella-like crown.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Part shade is best in hot summer climates. Performs best in moderately fertile soils with regular and consistent moisture. Avoid wet or poorly drained soils.
- **Growth:** Growing to be 20-30 feet tall and 20-35 foot in width.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large, 5" heart-shaped, broad leaves emerge a reddish purple and then as summer fades to fall they turn shades of orange, red-purple, and bronze.
- **Flower:** Its pink flowers, borne in tight clusters along the stems and branches before new leaves appear, create a showy spring display.
