

Moonglow Pear



Prunus communis 'Moonglow'

- **Use:** Ripens in early August and requires 500 chill hours for fruit to produce(4 weeks with temperatures 45 degrees F. or lower). The tree is disease-resistant to fire blight and will bear fruit for years. A strong pollinator for other pear varieties. Originates from Maryland, introduced in 1960. Harvest in mid August. Best pollinators: Bartlett Check the UGA article on our Plant Info Page on growing Pears.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. As long as it is properly established, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Growing to be 20-30 feet tall and 15-20 foot in width.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. It has an attractive upright oval form and glossy green leaves.
- **Flower/Fruit:** Big, bold, blushed fruit. This beautiful, Bartlett-type pear is soft and juicy without being mushy.
