

# Tangerine Beauty Cross Vine



## *Bignonia capreolata* 'Tangerine Beauty'

- **Use:** Heavy-flowering vine that never fails to awe when sporting orange-red flowers in bloom. On the roadsides, rambling through fence lines and tucked here and there in the wildlands of the South, the plant can make a strong statement. Put this vine in full sun in a modestly tended garden, and a cross vine in full bloom can literally take your breath away.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun preferred or at least 6 hours of afternoon sun. During the winter they prefer well-drained soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows to an average height of 10 to 20 feet, but can reach up to 30'. This vine clings to objects with tendrils that usually will not damage the object like other vines.
- **Hardiness:** 7b-9 Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Glossy green leaves turn bronze in fall.
- **Flower:** Boasts peachy-apricot flowers that bloom late spring to early summer.
