

Angyo Star Tree Ivy



One of the most beautiful selections of this popular plant form, a bi-generic cross between fatsia and hederia creating a vining shrub that is trouble free and useful as a low climber to 5 ft, a container plant, or ground cover. This cultivar, initially from Japan and shared with us by plantsman Ted Stephens.

Fatshedera lizei 'Angyo Star'

- **Use:** Large fan-shaped leaves add a bold tropical look to the landscape. Great in shaded entryways or patio; perfect for containers or as houseplants. This Japanese selection of the popular, deep shade-loving southern landscape shrub, *Fatsia japonica*, is prized by the few folks who have had the rare opportunity to own one.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Though it has been successful in exceedingly dark places, happiest in light shade with supplemental summer water where dry. Water when top 3 in of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 5-6' H x 4-5' W
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; Shrub-Vine or Houseplant. Hardy into the single digits. Can also be used as a houseplant.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Semi-upright stems display thick, 5-6" sweet-gum shaped leaves that are rich green and surrounded by a wide, creamy-white border
- **Flowers:** Not known for flowers.
