

Baby Wing Begonia



BabyWing Begonias feature dainty nodding orchid-like flowers at the ends of the stems from mid spring to mid fall.

Begonia x 'Baby Wing'

- **Use:** Baby Wing Begonia is a heat- and stress-tolerant winner. This vigorous plant has an upright, mounded growth that is covered with blooms from late spring through frost. With smaller leaves than the popular Dragon Wing begonia, the Baby Wing begonia sports masses of pink or white flowers on upright, 12- to 15-inch plants. Baby Wing begonia starts blooming earlier than Dragon Wing. Its bright, glossy leaves also add to its appeal.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Will tolerate sun or shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers if possible.
- **Growth:** Reaches about 12-15" tall inches high and 10-12" wide. Space plants 12 to 15 inches apart for dense coverage.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11, Annual, Houseplant. You can bring them indoor in winter.
- **Foliage:** Its attractive small glossy pointy leaves remain green in color throughout the year (if brought inside in winter).
- **Flower:** The delicate flowers appear in great clusters from spring until fall frosts.
