

Medora Begonia



Use in patio containers, hanging baskets, beds, or as a houseplant.

Begonia sp. 'Medora'

- **Use:** A gorgeous houseplant or for use in mixed planters on a shady porch in the warmer months. A compact, bushy grower with soft pink flowers. An heirloom cane-type begonia.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Performs well in part sun to shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Good drainage is a must. Likes high humidity.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-20" tall and 16-20" wide, maybe taller if deep shade or rich soil. Pinching tips and pruning outer stems in the growing season gives a bushier plant, good for hanging baskets.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone** 9-11, Annual, houseplant. Bring inside in winter.
- **Foliage:** It has small elliptical leaves that are a medium green and covered with silver spots. It has a bushy growth habit and branches freely.
- **Flower:** Pink clusters of blossoms on and off throughout the year.
