Moonlight Caladium



Well-layered, robust, and full, this is a showpiece of a caladium. Very adaptable to different garden spots, and looks terrific alongside other fancy-leaved types such as Sweetheart, or in contrast to its "strap" cousin Red Ruffles.

Caladium 'Moonlight'

- <u>Use:</u> Some white caladiums suffer from burn or become stressed-looking, but this new beauty keeps its fresh, ghostly appearance all season. Bred by University of Florida for superior use in small containers, it offers splendid long-lasting color with well-defined highlights on bushy, vigorous plants. Caladiums thrive outdoors during the warmer months and add a lush, exotic touch to your yard or garden. They look fantastic in pots next to your shady front entrance or on the deck.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in full sun (most colorful leaves) to full shade. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results, but don't leave them in soggy areas or too much water.
- **Growth:** Grows 22" tall and 24" wide depending on the amount you water and fertilize them.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 9-11 Annual Heat tolerant. Remains attractive for many months, asking only to be dug up before the first hard frost and stored in a cool, dark location until next spring.
- <u>Foliage</u>: Each medium, angular heart-shaped leaf on this plant is pure white, with a very thin dark green edge and spidery green minor veins. Down the midrib is a ribbon of brilliant magenta-purple, just to keep things interesting.
- **Flower:** Small spathe type flower. Not very noticeable.
