

# Asst Echeveria



Use in rock gardens, mixed containers and desert plantings

## ***Echeveria Asst***

- **Use:** A popular rosette-shaped soft succulents with a remarkable pastel color palette. Some varieties can grow to the size of a dinner plate and their pearlescent tones make them stunning focal points for potted arrangements, rock gardens, favors, decor, and much more. The rich diversity of colors, shapes, and sizes of Echeveria make them great additions to any project.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to light shade in a well-drained soil and irrigate regularly to occasionally in spring and summer. Best in pots with sandy soil. Do not tolerate wet feet.
- **Growth:** Full, well branched plants grow 1-2' tall and 2-3' wide.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 9-11**; Annual Very heat tolerant! Bring indoor in winter or into a garage. Hardy to 25 °F.
- **Foliage:** The leaves are fleshy and have a waxy cuticle on the exterior. Often the leaves are colored and a firm touch can mar the skin and leave marks.
- **Flower:** Flowers bloom in summer atop tall bracts
