## Echeveria /Succulents Asst

- <u>Use</u>: Succulents are water retaining plants that can adapt to harsh dry environments. They are extremely easy to care for and are available in variety of shapes, colors, and sizes. Their resilient nature makes them perfect for indoor terrariums as well as outdoor environments. Perfect for table centerpieces at your event, floral arrangements or just for planting in your garden in warmer months. The rich diversity of colors, shapes, and sizes of Succulents make them great additions to any project. Add an architectural flare to planters or even windowboxes outdoors.
- Exposure/Soil: Prefers full sun to light shade in a well-drained soil and irrigate regularly to occasionally in spring and summer. Best in pots with sandy soil. Succulents are extremely sensitive to overwatering and damp soil can cause root rot. Dry out soil completely between waterings. Recommended amount is once every two weeks. <u>Tip: top inch of soil should feel dry before watering again.</u> Do not tolerate wet feet. Fertilize every two to four weeks during spring and summer. Withhold fertilizer during the fall and winter months.
- Growth: Full, well branched plants grow 1-2' tall and 2-3' wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 9-11; Annuals Bring indoor in winter or into a sunny garage. Hardy to 45 °F.
- Foliage: The leaves are fleshy and have a waxy cuticle on the exterior. Often the leaves are colored and a firm touch can mar the skin and leave marks.
- Flower: Flowers bloom in summer atop tall bracts
