Marigolds are a great companion plant for pretty much all garden plants, blooming or edible. Their roots contain thiopene which is toxic to certain nematodes. Plant marigolds around the outside of your garden to discourage aphids and beetles from stopping by for and all you can eat smorgasbord.

Tagetes erecta 'Antigua Series'

- <u>Use</u>: Antigua Orange African Marigold The Antigua series has sturdy stems that support the weight of their blooms and are not affected by summer heat. <u>Additionally, marigolds will also attract beneficial in-</u> sects that will snack on the insects that are feasting on your plants. <u>Beans, carrots, cabbages and tomatoes are just a few plants that benefit from having marigolds as a companion plant.</u>
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers.
- **Growth:** The compact plant size—just 10 to 12 tall and 10 to 12" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 9-11, Annual, Houseplant
- Foliage: Its fragrant ferny leaves remain dark green in color throughout the season.
- **Flower:** Extra large, 3" fragrant double flowers bloom on branching stems from through summer into fall. They hold their doubleness and shed water well from summer until fall.
