Allium 'Mt Everest'

- **Planting density:** 6-8 inch apart
- **Planting depth:** 3-5 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** These 4in pure white blooms have a unique role in any late-spring border that seeks some gravitas. The snow white blooms of 'Mount Everest' also make bouquets of tall Aquilegias and other purple Alliums even more spectacular. Deer and rodent resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of sun) . Well-drained sandy soil. Tolerates summer drought, but should be kept moist during growing season.
- **Growth:** Grows 24-32” tall.
- **Hardiness:** Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Large, dramatic snowy white clusters of flowers shaped as large globes. Late spring blooming.
