Serendipity Ornamental Onion





Alliums are charming plants for the rock or herb garden. When the foliage is bruised, it smells like onions since they are in the onion family. Butterflies and honeybees adore the flowers' sweet nectar but deer and rabbits steer clear of this perennial beauty.

- <u>Use:</u> The word "serendipity" means an unexpected occurrence, and what a fitting name for this sport of the popular 'Millenium'! The sport shares all of the qualities that made 'Millenium' great, but with attractive blue foliage. Globe-like, rosy-purple flowers match the parent and are produced profusely in mid to late summer. When crushed, the leaves will emit a smell of onion. Deer, rabbit, and rodent resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of sun). Well -drained sandy soil. Tolerates summer drought, but should be kept moist during growing season.
- *Growth:* Grows 15-20" tall and 10-15" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-8b; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Blue, long, thin strap-like leaves. When crushed, the leaves will emit a smell of onion.
- <u>Flower</u>: Selected for late flowering with masses of rose-purple blooms, uniform habit with neat shiny green foliage that remains attractive season long, and for its drought resistant constitution.
