Giant Ornamental Onion



- Planting density: 3 bulbs per square foot
- Planting depth: 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass for dramatic effect.



Allium giganteum

- <u>Use:</u> Allium Giganteum lives up to its name! They are huge! With heights of 4-5 feet, this Allium is a show stopper. It's made up of perfect little purple florets that create a large round ball on top of a sturdy stem, similar to a topiary. Adding Allium to a garden will make heads turn and grab attention. The best way to plant is in large groupings for a more contemporary style or periodically place throughout a garden. Blooms in late spring to early summer. Deer and rodent resistant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full- part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of sun). Welldrained sandy soil. Tolerates summer drought, but should be kept moist during growing season.
- Growth: Grows 50-60" tall.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-9; Perennial
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- **<u>Flower</u>**: Producing large, 6-8-inch flower heads with a multitude of star-shaped lilac-colored blooms, on sturdy stalks of 4-5 feet. Giant Allium's flowers are long blooming and are excellent to use as cut flowers.
