

Picotee Amaryllis



Amaryllis 'Picotee'

- **Use:** The shapely blooms and rich, iridescent colors of Amaryllis light up a cold day like nothing else we know.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant when established, but prefers moist soil, but must be well-drained.
- **Growth:** The non-invasive stems spread out to 12-18" tall and 6-8" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10 ; Perennial; Herbaceous. (it is claimed that they are cold hardy down to zone 6) In zones 7 and below, we recommend deep planting (up to 4 inches of soil above the bulb) and a thick winter mulch.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Crisp white petals, with edges finely penciled in rich red, present a clean, tailored look that's utterly distinctive. This choice variety is heavy blooming, unusual, and always in short supply. Allow 8–10 weeks from bulb to bloom.
