Greek Windflower Blue Mix



- Planting density: 3
 -4 inch apart, 8 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 3 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 60 or more for dramatic effect.



- <u>Use:</u> This is a magical bulb flower that belongs in every wild-flower meadow. These are true wildflowers that are native to Greece, and carpet whole hillsides there in spring. The jewel-tone colors of these cheerful, upward-facing daisies make them unique and a spectacular treat in early spring. You can plant them in the lawn, too, like crocus. Be sure to plant a good number, and plant them close together so you'll have the "drift" effect. They look stunning in tight large groups.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Soak bulbs in luke warm water for 8-10 hours before planting. This will encourage them to sprout faster.
- **Growth:** Grows 4-6" tall.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- Foliage: Deciduous.
- **Flower:** Daisy-like flowers of deep blue, light blue, white, pink and cerise, with yellow centers. Long bloom time in midspring.
