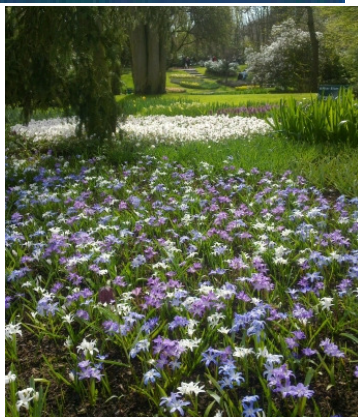


White Glory of the Snow



Chionodoxa luciliae 'Alba'

- Planting density: 2 -3 inch apart, 10 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 5 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 60 or more for dramatic effect.



- **Use:** Great naturalizers in rock and woodland gardens or in lawns; 'shoes and socks' plant for larger daffodils, tulips and hyacinths; late winter/early spring; Seeds itself freely to create lovely carpets. Great with early Narcissus, such as 'Tete-a-Tete'. Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-10" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous.
- **Flower:** Pure white 5-10 small starry flowers in a spray per stem in late winter/early spring;
