

Fragrant Crocus



- **Planting density:** 3-4 inch apart, 10 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 3-4 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 100 or more for dramatic effect.**

***Crocus sieberii* 'Tricolor'**

- **Use:** Planted in quantity, 'Tricolor' produces the same enchanting effect as a Crocus mixture, but all at once. Forced in a bowl, individual blooms are as intriguing as Orchids. This is a unique look in Crocus that will be around for a long time. Winner of the Award of Garden Merit from the Royal Horticultural Society.
- **Colorful Crocus** - the first sign of spring! Use them in borders or edging; in groups of a dozen or hundreds or thousands for naturalizing; in the grass, woodlands, slopes, or under trees. They bloom before lawns need cutting so feel free to plant the right along grassy banks and slopes.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun-shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant once established
- **Growth:** Grows 2-4" tall.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 4 –8** Bulb. Perennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Small grass-like leaves.
- **Flower:** A true exotic whose ravishing, lilac-blue petals are illuminated at the base by broad bands of golden yellow and white, all presented on striking dark brown stems. If that isn't enough, it's also fragrant. Early.
