

# Orange Crown Imperial, Fritillary



- **Planting density: 10-12 inch apart**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass for dramatic effect.**

## *Fritillaria imperialis 'Aurora'*

- **Use:** If there is hierarchy in a garden, Aurora is the Queen, standing tall and strong over its servants. Fritillaria is the center of attention in every spring garden. These large bulbs are a delight in practically any setting, and their unusual profile draws the eye like a magnet. impressive, colorful garden sculpture with tufts of green pineapple-like leaves on top of the large, hanging bell-shaped flowers. Their odor makes them deer and rodent resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Give them full sun and a rich, well-drained soil that stays dry in summer.
- **Growth:** Grows 24-32" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous.
- **Flower:** Orange, bell-shaped flowers on top of tall stems with faint purple veins and tufts of leaves on top of the flower and at the base of the stems.
